## **Existing literature**

Focus on general aspects as the growth of atypical contracts (Katz and Krueger, 2019) and the monopsonistic power of platforms on low-skilled workers (Dube et al., 2020).

Italian context, Boeri et al. (2018) and Giorgiantonio and Rizzica (2018) are the only existing sources of descriptive data about gig workers in the country.

Gig economy as a deeply heterogeneous market.

According to EU Commission 28.3 million of digital workers, 43 million in 2025.





#### **Questionnaire design**

The central elements in this work is the collection of original data.

#### Demographic and socioeconomic characteristics.

Gender, age, household composition, country of origin, type of permit, second job.

*Work conditions.* Income, dangerous situations, reported injuries and critical issues about the job.

Well-being. Associated with working conditions.
